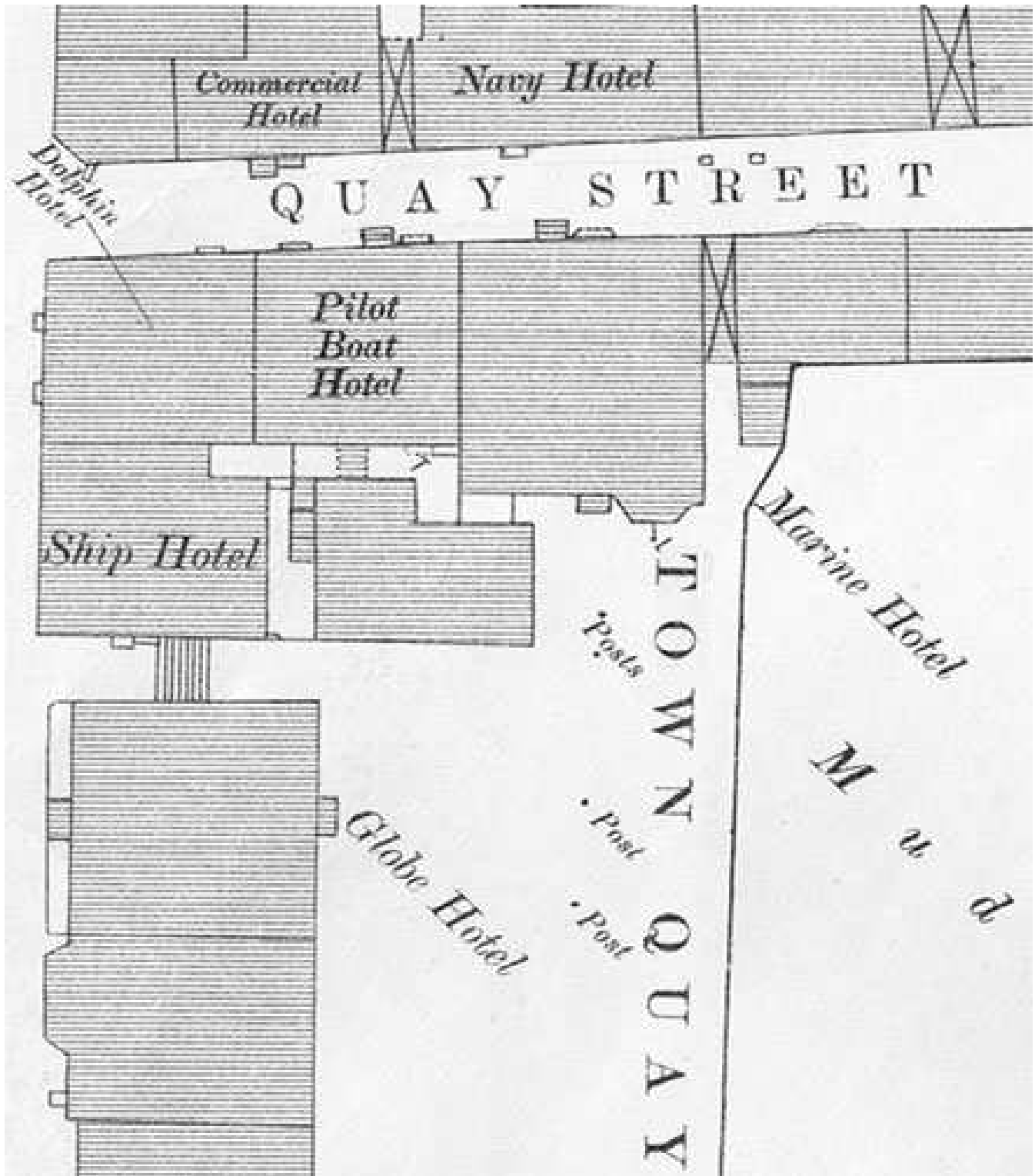


In 1880, the first Ordnance Survey map of Falmouth shows the position of hotels convenient to the administrative centre of the port



Dates for these properties are very hard to authenticate, here are some that have been found

The Globe Hotel built **1874** is now the Quay Side Inn

The Ship Hotel built is now Clark's Restaurant

The Dolphin Hotel built is now Bodene's Restaurant

The Pilot Boat Hotel built is Now a private residence, Shelton's Café & The Hut Restaurant

The Marine Hotel built **1660** is now the Chain Locker and the Chain Locker dates from **1742** (according to it's sign)

The Commercial Hotel Built is now the Bamboo House Chinese take-away & Seafood Bar

The Navy Hotel was formerly the town jail built **1660** and rebuilt after a fire in **1866** as a hotel and now is the Thai Restaurant. The original jail cells are now the dance floor of Shades night club which is under the restaurant.

The building directly below the Globe Hotel was previously owned by Lord Wodehouse as a residence and is now the Falmouth Harbour Commissioners Harbour Office built **1864**. First used as a Harbour Office in **1923**.

The building below the Harbour Office is the Customs building built **1785** this is the third site of a Customs House in Falmouth .

The building next to the Navy Hotel is Tocopilla House built **1810** and was the formerly the Old Watch House site of the second Seaman's Bethel founded **1849**
