**Confirmed – Red Arrows Performing in Falmouth**

Falmouth Harbour Commissioners (FHC) is delighted to confirm the spectacular Red Arrows display is back on the agenda for Henri Lloyd Falmouth Week, subject to the usual operational and weather requirements.

The Royal Air Force's world-famous aerobatics team is back for the second year on Wednesday August 11 in Falmouth inner harbour. Last year thousands of people flocked to the town and took up positions along the waterfront to watch the awesome display.

Earlier this week all RAF Hawk aircraft – including the Red Arrows – were grounded due to safety fears. Now the planes have been inspected and can take to the skies once again.

Dave Ellis, Chairman of FHC, which is sponsoring the Red Arrows display, said: “We are delighted to hear the Red Arrows will be performing once again at Henri Lloyd Falmouth Week and look forward to welcoming them back to the town.”

Since the team was formed in 1965, it has performed more than 4,000 displays in 53 different countries. All of the Red Arrows pilots have previously served in the front line as jet pilots in the Royal Air Force, with many having recently returned from Iraq and Afghanistan.

Falmouth Harbour Commissioners (FHC), the harbour authority for the port of Falmouth, has supported Henri Lloyd Falmouth Week for many years, regularly sponsoring the spectacular firework display.
