HIGH DEMAND FOR MOORING WAITING LIST

A high demand for moorings in Falmouth Harbour saw some eager boat owners queuing from the early hours of the morning last Tuesday (22nd January) to secure a place on the waiting list for swinging moorings.

With 588 swinging moorings in the inner harbour, the opening of the waiting list has always attracted a large amount of interest, but this year the number of registrations was exceptionally high reports Barry Buist, Leisure Services Manager for The Falmouth Harbour Commissioners:

“We had an extremely busy day registering interest from boat owners with over 100 new names added to the list. The popularity of leisure boating has gone from strength to strength in recent years and the demand for mooring places is indicative of that growth and Falmouth’s position as one of the county’s most popular ports for water sports.”

The length of time that boat owners will remain on the waiting list is dependent on the mooring size required and the availability of an appropriate space, but the average time between registration of interest and allocation of a mooring can be four to five years. Once allocated, moorings are available for as long as they are required but are reassigned if not used for two years.

The waiting list is regularly reviewed and is only opened once sufficient spaces become available, details will follow in the local press.
